Join us **THIS THURSDAY**, **11th February** at **9.30** in **ST PATRICK'S CHURCH** as we pray for the year ahead and celebrate the Catholic Character that is St Patrick's School.

ASH WEDNESDAY - TOMORROW (40 DAYS OF LENT)

We celebrate Ash Wednesday tomorrow and distribute the "Ashes" to pupils. (Years 1-3 in Chapel and Years 4-8 in hall) in a special liturgy.

THE '40 DAYS' OF LENT

Our "40 days" is a round number with symbolic meaning. The Jews spent "40 years" in the desert on their way to the Promised Land. Jesus spent "40 days and 40 nights" fasting in the desert before beginning his ministry.

However, fasting was always prohibited on Sunday, which meant the there were only 36 fasting days in the six week period. To make the Lenten fast include 40 days, the Church added four days of fasting (Ash Wednesday, and the Thursday, Friday and Saturday after Ash Wednesday). Lent itself ends on the evening of Holy Thursday (the vigil of Good Friday). We then begin the **Triduum**, the most sacred three days of the year, lasting through Easter Sunday evening.
