BUDDY CLASSES 2016

Every class at St Patrick's School has a "Buddy Class." We pair an older class with a younger one and they get together at various times. They read, play games, make things for each other and generally keep an eye out for each other.

ATTENDANCE DUES – 2016 (DON'T PANIC)

The Attendance Dues Committee of **Buster Harvey**, **Brian Peploe**, and **myself** are there to **ASSIST YOU** with Attendance Dues Payment in case of hardship.

The Catholic Schools Board's Attendance Dues (\$433.94) is the fee you committed to on enrolment of your child. This helps cover our property insurance premiums and capital works. Because the Government does not own St Patrick's we cannot use any of our Government Grants for these property costs. These fees paid for our NEW MARIST BLOCK – a **1.8 million dollar** project. Attendance Dues are not only a legal requirement, but a critical part of the preservation of your school.

EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT PLAN

The Board of Trustee have updated this plan in 2016. It covers how we (St Patrick's School) act and keep your children safe in the event of an emergency. It covers many aspects including Fire, Earthquake, Tsunami, Flooding, Lockdowns, Bomb Threats etc.

Each week we will focus on one procedure.

FIRE: Alarm sounds and we ring 111. Students are evacuated to designated assembly points and all buildings checked and cleared. Once a roll has been taken, that information is taken to the Emergency Warden (me) to ensure all students, staff, visitors etc are accounted for. Once the 'all clear' is given we go back to our rooms or we stay at our assembly points until students are taken home if that is necessary. Parents will be contacted by phone/twitter/txt as soon as practicable.
