### THE TWELVE DAYS OF CHRISTMAS

The twelve days of Christmas is actually a catechism song, which arose from a time when Catholics were not allowed to practice their faith openly. Without the regular liturgical celebrations or catechism lessons from the priests, the parents and priests needed a way to help the children continue to learn and keep the Catholic faith in their lives.

The 'true love' mentioned in the song, who gives all these gifts, refers to God himself. 'A partridge in a pear tree' is Jesus Christ. A mother partridge will fake injury to decoy predators from her helpless nestlings – the acts of the mother bird parallels with the sacrifice of Jesus for us.

## The symbolism continues throughout the song:

Two turtle doves – The Old and New Testaments

Three French hens – Faith, Hope and Charity

Four calling birds – The Four Gospels

Five golden rings – The first five books of the Old Testament

Six geese a laying – The six days of creation

Seven swans a swimming – Seven gifts of the Holy Spirit

Eight maids a milking – The eight Beatitudes

Nine ladies dancing – Nine choirs of Angels

Ten lords a leaping – The Ten Commandments

Eleven pipers piping – The eleven faithful Apostles

Twelve drummers drumming – the twelve points of belief in the Apostles Creed
