### LEADERS IN THE MAKING


On Monday, our 8 House Captains travel to Palmerston North, to be part of the 2017 National Young Leaders Day with Miss Ellingham and myself.

## PUPIL SAFETY - THE "PASSWORD" PLAN

At times your child may have to be picked up by a relative, friend, neighbour etc at the last minute as plans change. An idea to help your child "IDENTIFY" and "CONFIRM" that this person is meant to pick them up is to give them a "PASSWORD" that only they know and that you pass onto those who are doing the pick-up. For example, your password may be "Elephant." If the person picking up your child uses "Elephant" when asked for the password by the child then they know that you have said it is OK.

OF COURSE.... you should inform us at school to make doubly sure (JUST AN IDEA). IN CASE OF EMERGENCY

We have a School Emergency Management plan to help quide us in case of Emergency. (A copy is available in the school office). A whole range of Emergencies and actions are covered: e.g.

Tsunami - children are evacuated and then we move down Kennedy Rd to the Expressway overbridge.

Earthquake - Drop, Cover, Hold - then assemble at our evacuation point on the sports field.

Our main aim is to keep your children and staff safe. Parents will be notified as best as is possible through twitter, text, school app (on its way) and phone.
