- 1. Arrange an acceptable time to meet with the appropriate person.
- 2. The class teacher is always the first person to talk to.
- **3.** The Principal is always available to talk to parents who have exhausted the first avenue of approach, or have any concerns of a serious or sensitive nature, or wish to discuss matters concerning the school generally.

**4**. A Board of Trustees member or the Chairperson is the next alternative, if other avenues have been exhausted, or if you feel that your concerns have not been dealt with effectively.
