The Advent Wreath

The circular wreath composed of evergreens is a symbol of continuous and everlasting life. The four candles in the wreath mark the waiting period leading up to Christmas. One additional candle is lit on each Sunday of Advent to remind us that Jesus brings light into the world.

The first, second and fourth candles are purple while the third is pink or rose – this candle is a sign that we are over the halfway point!
